Chairwoman's Letter





In last year's newsletter I said that we would welcome volunteers to help run our events. I am delighted to be able to say that volunteers have stepped forward and we now have an Events Committee, dedicated to think of and organise events throughout the year. I am most grateful to those individuals for giving so generously of their time and bringing such enthusiasm and organisational skills to the Friends.

The other thing I asked for in last year's newsletter was suggestions from Friends for events you would like to see on

It seems a long time since the Appeal was first launched to raise the funds to purchase and redevelop Balhousie. Friends Events Committee

The Friends Events Committee (F.E.C) was set up in January 2012. The purpose of the F.E.C is to develop and run the Friends events programme. The F.E.C aims to deliver an interesting, varied and diverse event calendar alongside the Museum. The goal being to provide social contact with existing Friends, encourage new Friends to join, attract more

Museum Focus: Freddie Tait



This collection of golf equipment, pith helmet and khaki jacket belonged to Lieutenant Freddie Guthrie Tait, Officer of The Black Watch and amateur golf champion. Tait was born in Edinburgh to renowned physician and keen golfer Peter Guthrie Tait and it was through golf that Freddie was destined to follow in his father's footsteps.

A strong hitter of the ball, his drive of 341 yards went on to win him the amateur Championship twice (1896 and 1898). He also finished third in The Open Championship (1896 and 1897) and was the leading amateur in this competition six times. Tait's military career began at Sandhurst where he is believed to have introduced golf.

He then joined the 2nd Battalion Leinster Regiment before joining the 2nd Battalion, The Black Watch. It was with The Black Watch that Freddie fought in the Boer War where he received

a wound to his left thigh during the battle of Magersfontein in December 1899. Less than two months later he was back with his Battalion at Koodoosberg where he was tragically killed in action.

Freddie Tait is commemorated as a famous golfer and son of The Black Watch through Museums and Memorials from Scotland to South Africa.

Museum Redevelopment Update



We are pleased to report that there has been significant progress in the Castle and Museum redevelopment project since our 2011 newsletter. In February this year Perth and Kinross Council granted the necessary planning permission, and the following month The Heritage Lottery Fund confirmed an award of £778,000. This, together with the fantastic amount raised through The Black Watch Heritage Appeal and grants from charities such as The Gannochy Trust, Robertson Trust and the Rausing Trust, meant that our Trustees were delighted to give the go-ahead to commence this ambitious project. Alfie lannetta, C.E.O, The Black Watch Museum Trust, says "All those involved in supporting us to raise the funds for this ambitious project can look back with pride on what we have achieved as well as look forward with excitement to the opening of our redeveloped Castle and Museum."

In May work was commenced on our new car park. We were pleased to have this completed for the visit of Her Majesty The Queen in celebration of The Diamond Jubilee on the 6th July. The new car park provides space for the increased parking needed for visitors to the redeveloped Museum and tea room.

The contractors have now begun work on the foundation of the extension to the original Castle building. This extension will provide an area for special exhibitions, a designated learning space, improved storage for our artefacts, a new Museum shop and reception area and a much requested tea room and lift.

The Museum has managed to remain open throughout this stage of the redevelopment with what we hope has been minimal disruption to our visitors. Although we are planning to keep the Museum Shop open until the project is complete, the Museum itself will be closing its doors to the public on 31st August 2012 to allow the contractors to complete works in the existing building. During the closure the Museum will be internally redeveloped with new interpretation, displays and interactive and audio-visual equipment to enhance, preserve and share the legacy of The Black Watch.

Meanwhile staff will be busy packing up and storing the collection, developing our reopening strategy and recruiting staff and additional volunteers for the increased opportunities the redevelopment will bring.
